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1. Overview of operating results and others

Forward-looking statements presented in this report reflect judgments made as of the end of the fiscal year under review and accordingly are not guarantees of future performance.

(1) Overview of operating results during the fiscal year under review

During the fiscal year ended March 31, 2024, the Japanese economy as a whole was on a gradual recovery trend. This was due to positive factors such as progress in normalization of social and economic activity, as well as a resurgence in demand from inbound travelers, despite higher prices due to factors such as manpower shortages, higher personnel expenses, and persistently high raw material prices against a backdrop of yen depreciation.

In this business environment, in the second year of its medium-term management plan concluding in the fiscal year ending March 31, 2025, the Group has accordingly newly established contracting and logistics strategy committees, which have served as advisory bodies to the Board of Directors since April 2023, and is promoting cross-departmental initiatives that address the so-called 2024 problem in Japan's logistics industry and other prevailing Company-wide challenges, as well as initiatives that provide high value-added services and clarify medium- to long-term contracting and logistics business strategies including development of new business models. Through these initiatives, the Group will strive to further expand business and enhance profitability. In addition, we made substantial progress with increasing profitability in the airport-related business due to factors such as a rebound in international passenger flights, revision of unit prices and area expansion, and returned to profitability for the first time in four years since the fiscal year ended March 31, 2020. The Group will continue to endeavor to reinforce the structure and expand its domain for further resumption of international passenger flights and sustained development of the ground handling business.

In terms of profits, the Company reported operating profit of \$\frac{\pmathbf{\frac{4}}}{16,634}\$ million (25.6% increase year on year), ordinary profit of \$\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{17,034}\$ million (19.3% increase year on year), and profit attributable to owners of parent of \$\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{11,349}\$ million (36.7% increase year on year), despite having encountered persistently high fuel prices and electricity fees. The increases in profits were partially attributable to a return to profitability due to gains in transaction volume in the airport-related business, and also attributable to progress achieved with ongoing efforts to improve profitability, which constitutes a basic policy under the New Medium-Term Management Plan FY3/2023 - FY3/2025, launched in April 2022, as well as progress achieved in receiving appropriate unit prices and streamlining operations.

Financial results by segment are as follows. Note that segment profit represents operating profit before deducting general and administrative expenses.

(i) Integrated Solutions Business

Net sales increased 6.9% year on year to ¥201,965 million due to contributions from the resumption of international passenger flights in its airport-related business, increases in transaction volume resulting from a production boost by the Company's customers due to factors such as extreme heat as well as operations at new business sites in its food products-related business, ongoing acquisition of major spot work and unit price hikes associated with production contract work in its steel-related business, and orders for large-scale construction projects in its engineering-related business, although earthquake reconstruction work was completed in September 2022 and the Company no longer has business dealings with some customers.

Profit rose 33.9% year on year to ¥17,392 million mainly due to a return to profitability following the effects of gains in transaction volume in the airport-related business and acquisition of spot work in its steel-related business as well as due to receiving appropriate unit prices and thorough

operational streamlining, despite having encountered persistently high fuel prices and electricity fees and having incurred expenses for substantial repairs of a distribution center warehouse.

(ii) Domestic Logistics Business

Net sales increased 2.3% year on year to ¥53,901 million due in part to higher transaction volume in the food-related (temperature controlled) business largely associated with operations of new temperature-controlled warehouses, and also due to higher transaction volume in the life-related business particularly with respect to souvenirs and gas appliances.

Profit rose 1.1% year on year to ¥3,081 million due to the effects of the increase in net sales as well as our efforts to increase profitability by receiving appropriate unit prices and thorough operational streamlining, despite having encountered persistently high fuel prices and electricity fees.

(iii) International Logistics Business

Net sales decreased 15.8% year on year to ¥59,136 million, mainly due to the significant negative impact of a downturn in demand for maritime and air cargo along with a decrease in freight rates, despite higher warehousing and transportation volume in India, Thailand, the United States and elsewhere.

Profit decreased 15.3% year on year to ¥3,010 million due in part to lower transaction volume for business as a whole, despite increased revenue in some business sites due to operational streamlining.

(2) Future outlook

In Japan, while airport-related business is expected to recover due to expected continued progress in inbound demand, the business environment surrounding the Company remains challenging due to such factors as a worsening labor shortage, rising labor costs, prolonged inflation, and trends in monetary policy, etc.

In this business environment, under the basic policy of "Leveraging synergies between people and technology, striving to go beyond expectations in response to the changing times" in its New Medium-Term Management Plan FY3/2023 - FY3/2025, the Group is promoting initiatives with the key priorities of "Pursue Innovation," "Pursue Safety and Security," "Pursue Sustainability," and "Improve Profitability." By leveraging the Group's strengths in a wide range of technologies, from human and onsite expertise to new technologies, we will accurately identify signs of changes in the industry and customer needs to further raise the Group's corporate value.

As a result of these corporate activities, the Group's forecast of consolidated financial results for the following year (from April 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025) includes net sales of \$340,000 million, operating profit of \$18,000 million, ordinary profit of \$18,000 million and profit attributable to owners of parent of \$12,000 million.

(3) Overview of financial position during the fiscal year under review

(Total assets)

As of March 31, 2024, total assets amounted to \(\frac{\pma}{277}\),056 million, an increase of \(\frac{\pma}{11}\),034 million compared to the balance as of March 31, 2023.

(Current assets)

As of March 31, 2024, current assets amounted to \(\pm\)138,176 million, an increase of \(\pm\)5,921 million compared to current assets as of March 31, 2023. This result is mainly attributable to an increase of \(\pm\)4,579 million in notes and accounts receivable - trade, and contract assets and an increase of \(\pm\)1,055 million in other under current assets.

(Non-current assets)

As of March 31, 2024, non-current assets amounted to \(\pm\)138,880 million, an increase of \(\pm\)5,112 million compared to the balance as of March 31, 2023. This result is mainly attributable to an increase of \(\pm\)1,776 million in land, an increase of \(\pm\)1,035 million in buildings and structures, an increase of \(\pm\)954 million in investment securities, and an increase of \(\pm\)860 million in investments and other assets.

(Total liabilities)

As of March 31, 2024, total liabilities amounted to \(\pm\)140,975 million, a decrease of \(\pm\)1,252 million compared to the balance as of March 31, 2023.

(Current liabilities)

As of March 31, 2024, current liabilities amounted to ¥61,886 million, an increase of ¥9,359 million compared to current liabilities as of March 31, 2023. This result is mainly attributable to an increase of ¥10,000 million in current portion of bonds payable, an increase of ¥3,412 million in other under current liabilities, a decrease of ¥2,631 million in short-term borrowings, and a decrease of ¥2,228 million in current portion of long-term borrowings.

(Non-current liabilities)

As of March 31, 2024, non-current liabilities amounted to ¥79,089 million, a decrease of ¥10,612 million compared to non-current liabilities as of March 31, 2023. This result is mainly attributable to a decrease of ¥10,000 million in bonds payable, a decrease of ¥1,617 million in long-term borrowings, and an increase of ¥939 million in retirement benefit liability.

(Net assets)

As of March 31, 2024, net assets amounted to \\ \pm 136,081 \text{ million, an increase of \\ \pm 12,287 \text{ million} \) compared to the balance as of March 31, 2023. This result is mainly attributable to an increase of \\ \\ \pm 8,926 \text{ million in retained earnings and an increase of \\ \\ \pm 1,796 \text{ million in foreign currency translation} \) adjustment.

(4) Overview of cash flows during the fiscal year under review

(Cash flows from operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities was \(\pm\)17,687 million (a decrease of \(\pm\)1,105 million year on year). This is mainly due to profit before income taxes of \(\pm\)17,203 million, depreciation of \(\pm\)8,097 million, and income taxes paid of \(\pm\)6,349 million.

(Cash flows from investing activities)

Net cash used in investing activities was \(\frac{\pmathbf{x}}{7,839}\) million (an increase of \(\frac{\pmathbf{x}}{1,993}\) million year on year). This is mainly due to purchase of property, plant and equipment of \(\frac{\pmathbf{x}}{7,651}\) million, and purchase of intangible assets of \(\frac{\pmathbf{x}}{569}\) million.

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Net cash used in financing activities was \$9,896 million (an increase of \$6,348 million year on year). This result is mainly attributable to repayments of short-term borrowings of \$5,631 million and dividends paid of \$2,544 million.

In addition to the above, taking into account an increase of ¥513 million in effect of exchange rate change on cash and cash equivalents, cash and cash equivalents as of March 31, 2024 increased by ¥533 million to ¥68,114 million from the end of the previous fiscal year.

(5) Basic policy for profit allocation, and dividends for the current and the next fiscal year

The Company's basic policy is to aim to realize dividends in a continuous and stable manner and in response to financial results and earnings conditions while enhancing internal reserves, comprehensively taking into account financial results in each fiscal year, strengthening of financial structure, medium- to long-term business strategies, and other matters.

The Company maintains a basic policy to pay dividends of retained earnings twice a year, and has prescribed in the Articles of Incorporation that "(the Company) shall determine the matters provided for in each item of paragraph 1 of Article 459 of the Companies Act, (including dividend of retained earnings, etc.) by a resolution of the Board of Directors not by a resolution of General Meeting of Shareholders, except as otherwise provided for in the laws and regulations."

Based on the above basic policy, the Company plans to pay dividends of ¥65 (consisting of ¥24 in interim dividend and ¥41 in year-end dividend) per share for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2024.

The Company intends to make use of retained earnings to further enhance its management structure and for future business development. For the next fiscal year, the Company plans to pay a dividend of \mathbb{\xi}70 per share.

2. Basic approach to the selection of accounting standards

Although the Group is developing its business both in Japan and overseas, management has decided to adopt Japanese GAAP for the time being, since the current business platform is mainly based on outsourcing contracts from companies in Japan.

However, we expect that overseas net sales and the ratio of foreign shareholders will gradually increase in the future as we strengthen overseas business development, which is one of the Group's growth strategies. With a view toward adopting IFRS (International Financial Reporting Standards) in the future, the Company intends to prepare an internal system and to consider the timing of IFRS adoption.

(Additional information)

(Misconduct by employees of the Company)

During a tax examination by the Osaka Regional Taxation Bureau, the Company recognized the possibility that employees of the Company colluded with subcontractors of the Company to record fictitious outsourcing expenses and other costs. The Company immediately launched an internal investigation team, conducted an investigation with cooperation from external experts, and confirmed that the fictitious billing and embezzlement by the employees had, in fact, occurred. In order to conduct a Company-wide investigation while ensuring objectivity in confirming whether there have been other cases of misconduct similar to this one and to evaluate recurrence prevention measures, etc., the Company formed the Internal Control and Investigation Committee, appointing external attorneys at law as the chair and vice chair of the Committee, and has conducted an investigation related to the facts in this matter. The Company received a final report from the Internal Control and Investigation Committee.

As a result of the investigation by the Internal Control and Investigation Committee, it was found that the total amount of the fraud was ¥549 million during the period from the fiscal year ended March 31, 2021 to the fiscal year ended March 31, 2024. Since the impact of this matter on the operating results in each period of the previous fiscal years was negligible, there are no revisions to the Securities Reports or Quarterly Securities Reports for the previous fiscal years, or the Quarterly Securities Reports for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2024.

Regarding the impact on the consolidated financial statements for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2024, the Company recorded accounts receivable - other that eliminated the excessive amount of \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4}\) million (tax excluded) from cost of sales. At the same time, since the recoverability of these receivables is uncertain, the Company established an allowance for doubtful accounts, taking into account the recoverability of the remaining amount of \(\frac{\pmathbf{3}}{3}\)42 million (tax included) that excludes the amount already recovered, and recorded \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2}\)84 million in provision of allowance for doubtful accounts as non-operating expenses. As a result, operating profit increased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4}\)41 million and ordinary profit increased by \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{1}\)56 million from the initial estimates.

In the future, the Company will certainly proceed with initiatives to prevent recurrence, based on the monitoring by Management Quality Council.

(Segment information)

1. Overview of reportable segments

The Company's reportable segments are components of the Company for which separate financial information is available and which are subject to periodic review by the Board of Directors in order to determine the allocation of management resources and evaluate their performance.

The Company's original business was transportation, but as a result of expanding its business from contracted transportation services for customers, it now undertakes a wide range of services, including process outsourcing at customers' plants and installation of plant equipment and facilities. Business divisions are organized by service, and each division headquarters formulates strategies for the services it provides and develops business activities. Therefore, the Company is composed of segments based on business divisions by service, and has three reportable segments: Integrated Solutions Business, Domestic Logistics Business, and International Logistics Business.

Integrated Solutions Business provides customer-oriented services such as in-plant transportation, transportation, and mechanical engineering. Domestic Logistics Business is engaged in the temperature-controlled logistics business based on frozen and refrigerated warehouses, and the general logistics business based on dry warehouses. International Logistics Business provides maritime and air cargo handling services and import/export cargo warehousing services in Japan and overseas.

2. Method for calculating amounts of net sales, profits or losses, assets and other items by reportable segment

Accounting methods for reportable business segments are in accordance with the accounting policies used to prepare the consolidated financial statements.

Profit of reportable segments is based on operating profit.

Intersegment revenue or transfers are based on actual market price.
