(Update on Previous Disclosure) Notice Concerning the Opinion of the Board of Directors on the Shareholder Proposal

Wacom Co., Ltd. (the “Company”) announced that, with respect to the agenda items for the Company’s 43rd ordinary shareholders’ meeting scheduled to be held on June 25, 2026, the Company disclosed in its announcement titled “Notice Concerning the Opinion of the Board of Directors on the Shareholder Proposal” dated May 13, 2026, that the Board of Directors had resolved to oppose the shareholder proposal received by the Company (the “Shareholder Proposal”).

The Company further announces that, at a meeting of the Board of Directors held on May 20, 2026, the Board of Directors resolved to make certain additions to the matters stated in the opinion of the Board of Directors, as set forth below.

1. Agenda Item

Proposal No. 8: Dismissal of Two (2) Directors

2. Additions to the Matters Stated

The additions are indicated by underlines.

(1) Opinion of the Board of Directors

After deliberation based on the recommendation of the Nominating Committee, the Board of Directors opposes this Shareholder Proposal.

(2) Reasons for Opposition

At the same time, in response to the Shareholder Proposal, the Company sincerely recognizes that, from the perspective of clarity and transparency from both internal and external viewpoints, more thorough explanations and a more rigorous operating framework were necessary. Accordingly, the Company has promptly suspended its permission for Connected Ink Village to use the Company’s office space, as well as any new activities to be undertaken with Connected Ink Village, and will conduct a review—from the perspectives of substance, procedures and governance—of the Company’s relationship with Connected Ink Village, including facility-use permissions and donations, and the management and the

process for the selection of performers of Connected Ink activities in which the Company is involved, including the Connected Ink event and other events. The Company will fundamentally overhaul these arrangements to ensure fairer and more transparent operations.

In addition, the Company has not made any donations to Connected Ink Village since the fiscal year ending March 2026 and will not make any such donations going forward.

Furthermore, going forward, the Company will not permit appearances by relatives of the Company's officers in any Connected Ink activities including the Connected Ink event and other events that are hosted, co-hosted, sponsored, funded, provided with facilities or operationally supported by the Company.

As described above, there is no reason to dismiss President Ide or Director Nakajima, and the Company believes that both individuals are indispensable to the sustainable enhancement of the Company's corporate value and the common interests of shareholders, and that their dismissal under this Shareholder Proposal is not appropriate. Accordingly, the Board of Directors opposes this Shareholder Proposal.
