## **Our Position on the Request from the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications for the Sustainable Development of the Hometown Tax Donation System**

We have received the request to portal site operators for the sustainable development of the hometown tax donation system, which was announced by the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications on May 22, 2026, through the General Incorporated Association Hometown Tax Association, of which the Company is a member. Accordingly, we hereby announce the Company's current position on this matter.

### Note

#### 1. The Company's Basic Policy on the Hometown Tax Donation System

The Company recognizes the hometown tax donation system as an important initiative that contributes to regional revitalization, not only by enabling support for local communities through donations, but also through the promotion of regional industries, the resolution of challenges faced by municipalities, and the creation of people connected to local communities.

Based on the purpose of the system, the Company has worked to improve convenience for donors, municipalities, and providers of gifts in return, while promoting various initiatives aimed at revitalizing regional economies and fostering sustainable local communities.

Specifically, through crowdfunding-type hometown tax donation and the Hometown Tax Donation Regional Revitalization Collaboration Lab, which promotes collaboration among industry, government, and academia, the Company has been working to address social issues by combining individual and corporate versions of the hometown tax donation system. In addition, the Company has made efforts toward the sound expansion of the market while appropriately responding to system revision and changes to operational rules.

#### 2. The Company's View on Fees Received from municipalities

Based on agreements with municipalities, the Company receives prescribed fees to cover the costs necessary for operating the hometown tax donation portal site, providing information to donors, supporting municipalities and providers of gifts in return, handling payment-related operations and inquiries, and enhancing awareness of the system.

The Company deeply understands that the hometown tax donation system is utilized as an important financial resource for enhancing administrative services and promoting regional development by municipalities. Accordingly, from the perspective of enhancing the soundness and sustainability of the system, the Company has reviewed its fee structure and has voluntarily implemented phased fee reductions since the previous fiscal year.

The Company sincerely acknowledges this request as one intended to support the sustainable development of the hometown tax donation system. Going forward, the Company will continue to engage in dialogue with the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications, municipalities, and industry associations, while striving to conduct appropriate business operations in line with the purpose of the system. The Company will also continue to comply with applicable laws and regulations and contribute to the sustainable development of the

hometown tax donation system through the leveling of donation demand and the sound expansion of the market.

3. Impact on Financial Results for the Current Fiscal Year and Future Outlook

The phased revisions to the fee structure that the Company has implemented to date have already been incorporated into the earnings forecast for the current fiscal year. In addition, revisions scheduled to be applied in the future that have already been agreed upon with municipalities will be appropriately reflected in future business planning.

With regard to the current request, the Company will continue to respond appropriately through ongoing dialogue with the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications, municipalities, and other relevant parties. At this time, however, there are no matters requiring revisions to the full-year earnings forecast.
