1. Qualitative Information Regarding Results for the Nine Months

As used herein, "Ateam", "we", "our" and similar terms include Ateam Inc. and its subsidiaries, unless indicated otherwise.

(1) Explanation of Operating Results

Ateam Inc. and its consolidated subsidiaries adhere to the corporate philosophy "to produce happiness through business and to grow for the next 100 years". Operating in various technical and business fields, the corporate officers and employees unite under this corporate philosophy to plan, develop and operate game content, comparison and information websites, and e-commerce sites that are supported and used by individual users via the internet. Specifically, we are operating business in three core segments.

The Entertainment Business engages in the planning, development and operation of game and tool applications primarily for smart devices. The Lifestyle Support Business engages in the planning, development and operation of various online services that allows users to easily gather and compare valuable information. The E-Commerce Business engages in the planning, development and operation of our online bicycle store under the name "cyma".

During the nine months ended April 30, 2019, although revenue for the Entertainment Business and E-Commerce Business declined year on year, the Lifestyle Support Business showed strong performance, thus overall revenue remained flat from the same period of the previous year.

On the contrary, in regard to operating income, ordinary income, and net income attributable to shareholders of parent company, the limited profit contribution from the Entertainment Business, in addition to upfront investment in new businesses within the Lifestyle Support Business resulted in an overall year on year decline.

As a result of the above, during the nine months ended April 30, 2019, Ateam posted revenue of 28,028 million JPY (down 1.1% year on year), operating income of 2,175 million JPY (down 42.9% year on year), ordinary income of 2,177 million JPY (down 43.5% year on year), and net income attributable to shareholders of parent company of 1,100 million JPY (down 58.5% year on year).

The operating performance by segment for the nine months ended April 30, 2019 was as follows:

Entertainment Business

We strive to administer fun to consumers worldwide by providing mobile game and tool applications via platforms specializing in the distributions of such applications (such as App Store and Google Play). Although most of our game and tool applications are available for free download, our primary revenue source is through in-app purchases (such as in-game currency and items).

In the nine months ended April 30, 2019, existing game applications continued on a downward trend, in addition to limited contribution of the new game application, "Revue Starlight Re LIVE" which was released domestically in October 2018, and overseas as of April 24, 2019, thus resulting in a year on year decrease in both revenue and profit.

As a result, during the nine months ended April 30, 2019, the Entertainment Business posted revenue of 10,114 million JPY (down 19.2% year on year) and operating income of 1,257 million JPY (down 57.3% year on year).

Lifestyle Support Business

In the Lifestyle Support Business, we develop various online services to help support individual users throughout their daily lives and specific life events. Made up of several sub-segments, each sub-segment revolves around the same business concept of "Sanpo- Yoshi", a Japanese saying that means benefiting all three sides involved - the consumer, the partner company and Ateam.

Our sub-segments consist of the Moving-related business, the Automobile-related business, the Bridal-related business, the Financial Media business, and others.

The Moving-related business provides users with competitive prices from several moving companies. The Automobile-related business consists of inputting your car information, and receiving quotes from second-hand car dealers. The Bridal-related business assists with finding the perfect wedding chapel that meets the consumers' financial budget. And lastly, the Financial Media business lets users analyze prices and benefits for financial related needs. Each sub-segment business is free of charge for the users; our primary revenue source is based on commission via referrals we provide to our partnered companies.

In the nine months ended April 30, 2019, the Lifestyle Support Business, especially the bridal-related business, performed well. In the bridal-related business, revenue increased significantly as the number of customer referrals steadily grew with the recognition of service name and improved service reliability. As for segment profit, each subsegment proceeded to develop existing businesses and expand peripheral services, in addition to continuing upfront investments in multiple new services still in its early stages, resulting in flat profit year on year.

As a result, during the nine months ended April 30, 2019, the Lifestyle Support Business posted revenue of 16,377 million JPY (up 18.3% year on year) and operating income of 2,351 million JPY (up 1.6% year on year).

E-Commerce Business

Our E-Commerce Business was established in 2013, with "cyma" being our first service stemming from this concept. We currently own warehouses in the Tokai, Kanto and Kansai areas, which are stockpiled with bicycles we purchased from both domestic and oversea manufacturers. Each warehouse employs certified mechanical staff, making it possible to deliver fully assembled bicycles directly to the consumer's doorstep. Our primary revenue source is through bicycle sales and/or related accessories from our online store.

"Cyma" offers more than 200 bicycle models, a broader lineup than a traditional retailer. We also make sure to offer after-sales services, including a one-year warranty for certain repairs and/or damages.

In the nine months ended April 30, 2019, revenue decreased while operating loss was minimized year on year. As a result of continued effort to break-even by reviewing and improving shipping efficiency and other distribution operations, we achieved single-month profit during the busy season in March. We will continue to strengthen fulfillment to optimize operations.

As a result, during the nine months ended April 30, 2019, the E-Commerce Business posted revenue of 1,535 million JPY (down 22.4% year on year) and operating loss of 166 million JPY (compared with an operating loss of 190 million JPY in the previous fiscal year).

(2) Explanation of Financial Position

(i) Assets

As of the end of the third quarter under review, we posted total assets of 16,956 million JPY, an increase of 253 million JPY compared with the previous fiscal year. This was due to an increase of 273 million JPY in notes and accounts receivable – trade along with an increase of 896 million JPY in investment securities, despite a decrease of 980 million JPY in cash and deposits.

(ii) Liabilities

As of the end of the third quarter under review, we posted liabilities of 4,811 million JPY, a decrease of 236 million JPY compared with the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to a decrease of 432 million JPY in income taxes payable, despite an increase of 200 million JPY in long-term guarantee deposited.

(iii) Net Assets

As of the end of the third quarter under review, we posted net assets of 12,144 million JPY, an increase of 489 million JPY compared with the previous fiscal year. This was mainly due to an increase of 466 million JPY in retained earnings.

(3) Explanation of Consolidated Earnings Forecasts and Other Forward-Looking Statements

In the fiscal year ending July 31, 2019, Ateam will continue to strengthen and expand each business segment, while pushing forward with upfront investment to create new businesses and enhance business portfolio to achieve sustainable growth and improve corporate value over the medium- to long-term. As part of these measures, we will focus on acquiring talented personnel, developing human resources, improving work environments and improving organizational structure.

However, in light of current trends in business results, we have revised our consolidated earnings forecast for the fiscal year ending July 31, 2019 as mentioned below.

The outlook for consolidated business results for the full fiscal year is as follows.

In regard to revenue, although the Lifestyle Support Business is expected to slightly outperform initial forecast, the Entertainment Business and EC Business fall short of original expectations, thus overall revenue will be lower than anticipated. In the Entertainment Business, both existing and new games underperformed, with newly released "BASSA WARRIORS" unable to improve from recovery phase, thus resulting in a decline from initial estimates. As for the EC Business, as a result of giving priority to restructuring of logistic operations, revenue is expected to fall below initial forecasts.

In regard to operating income and ordinary income, with limited profit contribution due to a decrease in revenue and increase in personnel for new game developments within the Entertainment Business, and the EC Business unable to break-even for the full-year, we expect both operating income and ordinary income to fall below initial forecasts.

As for net income attributable to shareholders of parent company, due to the recorded extraordinary loss for software assets related to development expense of the game "BASSA WARRIORS", net income is expected to fall significantly below initial forecasts.

For these reasons mentioned above, the consolidated financial forecast for the full fiscal year will be revised as mentioned below.

The aforementioned forward-looking statements and the earnings forecasts provided have been prepared based on information readily available to Ateam as of the date of this material's release. Actual results may differ due to the effect of various factors in the future.
